For Public Dissemination Alabama Drought Declaration

In accordance with the Alabama Drought Planning and Response Act (Code of Ala. 1975, §9-10C-1, et seq.) and the Alabama Drought Management Plan, the ADECA Office of Water Resources (OWR), based on a review of current and anticipated conditions, has declared the following portions of Alabama to be under the specified drought declaration levels.

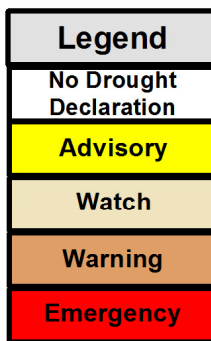
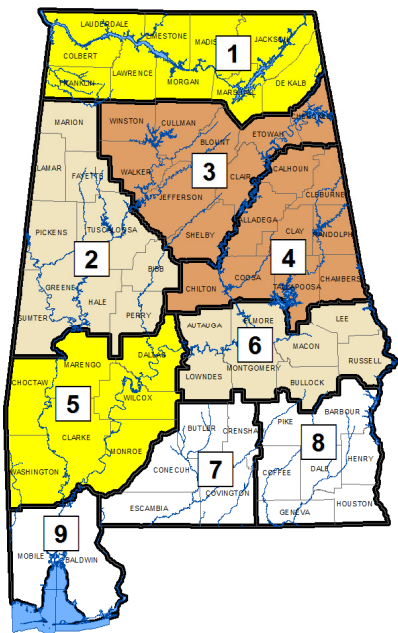

Warning **Regions 3 and 4 in the Alabama Drought Management Plan which includes the counties of:** Blount, Calhoun, Chambers, Cherokee, Chilton, Clay, Cleburne, Coosa, Cullman, Etowah, Jefferson, Randolph, Shelby, St. Clair, Talladega, Tallapoosa, Walker, and Winston

Watch **Regions 2 and 6 in the Alabama Drought Management Plan which includes the counties of:** Autauga, Bibb, Bullock, Elmore, Fayette, Greene, Hale, Lamar, Lee, Lowndes, Macon, Marion, Montgomery, Perry, Pickens, Russell, Sumter, and Tuscaloosa

Advisory **Regions 1 and 5 in the Alabama Drought Management Plan which includes the counties of:** Choctaw, Clarke, Colbert, Dallas, DeKalb, Franklin, Jackson, Lauderdale, Lawrence, Limestone, Madison, Marengo, Marshall, Monroe, Morgan, Washington, and Wilcox

None **Regions 7, 8, and 9 in the Alabama Drought Management Plan which includes the counties of:** Baldwin, Barbour, Butler, Coffee, Conecuh, Covington, Crenshaw, Dale, Escambia, Geneva, Henry, Houston, Mobile, and Pike



The state has continued to experience relief from drought conditions over the last several weeks with widespread rainfall. As a result, there has been some short-term improvements in streamflows, reservoir levels, and groundwater levels in many locations. However; the rainfall, while beneficial, has not been enough to overcome significant long-term deficits. It will take continued rainfall over a longer period of time to offset the overall impact of drought deficits. Water managers are urged to carefully monitor water sources and amend water conservation measures as needed. Public water system customers are encouraged to follow their local water system's recommendations regarding water use. All other water users should make prudent decisions on their water use to protect available water resources.
